At Fadden PS we believe that children need to be happy and safe to be the best learners they can be. One of the priorities within our strategic and annual action plans is to improve student wellbeing. We have a number of strategies in place to enable this and since the commencement of the 2017 – 2021 strategic plan have seen positive improvements in whole school approaches to supporting the many and varied needs of children. We have also seen a decrease in disruptive behaviours as a result of quality teaching and systematic procedures.

Attached to this newsletter is a copy of our updated Student Wellbeing Procedures. The procedures outline the beliefs and values of our school as well as the universal, targeted and individualised strategies utilised to provide a safe and supportive environment for all children and staff.
