The next tier on our Acknowledgment Continuum is our Certificate of Achievement awarded to students who earn 200 tokens in each area, and it is presented along with a Foxy Fadden Key Ring. We can’t wait to find out who the first student is to be awarded with this acknowledgment!

This week we have confirmation that the building extension work in Kindergarten and Year 1/2 teaching blocks has been completed. However, the fenced off areas of the playground in that area will continue to be the set down yard for the works which are continuing in our school.

Below are photos of the newly extended room in our Kindergarten block. I have added a red line to show you where the room used to have a wall of cupboards, with corridor behind, which has been removed to open up the space and increase the room size to support quality teaching and learning.



Our next two blocks currently under construction are in our Year 3/4 and 5/6 + LSU blocks, marked on the map below in yellow. This work is expected to be finished early in December 2022.



Although our water bubblers are back in operation, I do recommend that students bring in a water bottle, so they can drink during class times without needing to leave class, and also have water available during sports lessons. Hydration is very important during the hotter months, *whenever they get here*, so please ensure your child has a named water bottle at school.
