Welcome to back to school and Term 2!

This week we have had a team of 4 external reviewers in our school interviewing staff, students, parents and partners as part of our School Review. Schools across Australia are reviewed against the National School Improvement Tool (NSIT) which has 9 domains. This process allows schools such as ours to better understand where they are at and the steps necessary to move forward to become a high performing school which effectively caters for the learning of all students.

Staff had the opportunity to hear some of the draft commendations, affirmations and recommendations yesterday afternoon. However, an Executive Summary will not be available for the school community for a few weeks yet, as it needs to be moderated and confirmed by ACER (Australian Council of Education Research) before it is confirmed. I can share however that the reviewers did reinforce for us that we are in an excellent position, with a number of foundations laid over the past 18 months, to make a big impact on our school and student learning here at Fadden. I was especially thrilled to hear that our parents are supportive and have trust in the school and it's leaders. With this base I truly believe the sky is the limit on what we can achieve together.

I would like to genuinely thank all parents that had the opportunity to contribute, whether that was spontaneously meeting a reviewer in the carpark or as a scheduled panel member. Your voices and the information collected through the review will be vital for us to plan our next 5-year improvement journey and take Fadden Primary from good to great!

Today all students participated in an ANZAC Day commemoration run by our Student Leadership Council. It was a fantastic opportunity for our students to learn more about ANZAC Day and the associated traditions. Classes created wreaths that students then laid at our flagpole at the front of the school. Thank you to the School Leadership Council and Mr Matthews for organising such an important event for us.
